A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings Church! As I complete my classes at Phillips Theological Seminary and prepare for my ordination interview, I reflect on those who have helped me recognize my call to the Ministry. Unfortunately, the two who were instrumental in helping me are no longer with us on this earth. It is hard to swallow that if and when I am ordained, they will not be physically with us to celebrate this moment in my life. This makes my heart break. It makes me grieve their loss all over again with the questions and anger regarding how they could have been taken so early in their lives.

We all experience grief. It is a universal truth about being human that we can not escape. The tricky thing is that no two people experience grief in the same way. Some of us express our grief by mourning openly and others prefer to mourn in private. Some of us take any opportunity to talk about the person who died and others prefer not to talk at all. Some seek comfort in religion, while others question their faith.

Grief is universal, and yet, individual. Our grief is our own, and all of our feelings and expressions of grief are OK. There is no "right" or "wrong" way to grieve. No pattern is better or worse. They are simply expressions of the fact that each person copes with loss in a personal way.

This can become problematic when there is a failure to acknowledge that people handle loss differently, even in the same family. Differences in grieving styles are simply that; they do not represent differences in the love for the person who has died. Different grieving styles do not need to be a source of conflict. In fact, complementary ways of coping can be a source of strength.

1 Thessalonians 4:13 "13 Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope."So, when we grieve, our grief is different because we know they are with the Lord, which is better by far. In (Philippians 1:23) we are reminded that we shall meet them again. We grieve, but it is not without hope.

One thing that has helped me is a ministry called GriefShare. GriefShare is a video seminar series that features some of the nation's foremost Christian experts on grief and recovery topics as seen from a biblical perspective. The video seminars are combined with support group discussion of the materials presented during the video.

The journey of grief is a painful process, and you do not need to walk it alone. I would like to encourage you to come to the special seminar and support group offered. The materials specifically address topics and issues for those who are grieving the death of a loved one.

GriefShare meets weekly for thirteen weeks and the content is Christ-centered and biblical. You will find this to be a place where you can be around people who understand the pain of your loss. You will be prayed for and learn valuable information that will help you through this difficult season of your life.

Our GriefShare group starts April 20th from 6pm to 8pm at First Christian Church (340 N. Main in Kenton). I hope you will consider joining us. See ya on Sunday! Pastor Bruce
